- certain practices related to delivery
- female circumcision
- nutritional taboos and forced feeding of women
- early childhood marriage

as well as promotion of good traditional practices, such as breastfeeding and baby massage.

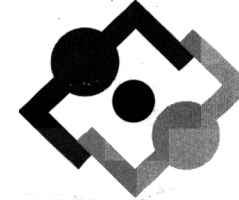
